Area of learning	Activities
<p>UW: The world Technology People and communities</p>	<p>Look at the picture given for the week (see below)</p>  <p>Bbbrrrrr it's winter! Look at this cold wintry picture. Can you think of 1 thing about the winter that you like (snow/ making a snowman?) Can you google this? - ask a parent to help you if you need it! Can you find out 1 piece of information or 1 wintry picture that you like. Why do you like it? Talk about it with your mummy or daddy. <p>EAD Exploring media and materials Being imaginative</p>	<p>Art: Can you make a wintry picture? Example: If you have white paint and a straw, get the white paint, put it on some coloured paper and using the straw, blow the paint around the paper - does it look like snow? Again look at youtube - there are some lovely ideas!</p> <p>Please can you look at this on Friday</p> <p>Music: Can you think of or find some winter songs? YouTube has some lovely winter nursery rhymes! RE	<p>New topic God made animals</p>	<p>How many animals can you think of in one minute? Where do you think these animals come from? Explain that the Bible tells us in the first book <i>Genesis</i>, that God made the whole world and everything in it. He made the animals too. Share the creation story. You may have your own lovely children's Bibles, but if not here is an online version of the story. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=teu7BCZTgDs Emphasise the day God made animals and explain that this half term we will be looking at stories in the Bible in which animals played an important part. Perhaps you can make a collection of all the animals you have in your house? Could you paint/draw a picture of your favourite animal? You could make it out of play dough or natural materials from the garden? Use whatever you have at home. Extra activity: Sing/listen to 'If I were a Butterfly' and reflect on the words that God gave the animals what they needed to be them i.e. fish the sort of bodies that enable them to swim, birds the wings that help them fly. As you listen/watch can you make actions to go with each animal? This was Mrs Lloyd's favourite song from school as a child! <p>Literacy Reading C&L: Listening and attention Speaking Understanding</p>	<p>Please continue to read daily and continue to look at the keywords. Please record in your yellow reading record.</p> <p>Phonics: Please continue to look at the sounds we have covered so far. Please use the phonics that were sent out at the end of last half term. Remember to continue to practice the sounds and how to form each letter. We will be moving on to the next set of sounds. A video will be sent out like last term to help support you.</p> <p>Ongoing - daily</p>	
<p>Literacy Writing</p>	<p>We are starting to look at adjectives (describing words). Can you use the keywords "I can see a/ some..." to talk about the picture? Can you add a simple adjective to extend learning? Example: I can see some white snow or I can see a brown bench.</p> <p>Extra activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Education city (login at the back of your yellow reading record) - there are some lovely sound games to play. <p>Please can you do this on Tuesday</p>	
<p>Maths: Numbers Shape, space and measure</p>	<p>In maths we are continuing to work on adding 2 numbers together in order to find a total. Can you write number sentences down (challenge 1 x double digit and 1 x single digit) and solve it? Remember to use correct language and signs and symbols (example: $14 + 3 =$) Remember to make this as fun and as practical as you can - can you use teddies? coins? toys etc to help you?</p> <p>Extra activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Writing numbers to 10 • Number blocks on cbeebies
