Colonavirus – Full Return to School

September 2021



Anyone who has any symptoms, such as a new persistent cough or high temperature or loss of smell or taste, must not enter the school site. Anyone displaying symptoms must self-isolate together with their families as detailed in the full guidance and seek a PCR test, the result of which should then be shared with the school and appropriate actions taken.

This risk assessment has been completely rewritten following a significantly reduced guidance document.

The Government has decided to move to step 4 of the roadmap on 19 July, a new phase of continued caution whilst managing the risks of COVID-19.

		If unwell pupils are waiting to go home, they will be instructed to use a different toilet (disabled toilet) then handwashing can be supervised at a distance to the rest of the school to minimise the spread of infection. This would then be closed for use until it can be fully disinfected as soon as the pupil has left. (see government guidance)		
		The bin from the pod and any first aid waste should then be collected, bagged and labelled with details of pod, date of symptoms and date (72 hours later) when the bag can then be disposed of.		
		Parents are advised to contact 999 if their child becomes seriously ill or their life is at risk.		
		The Head/Head of School will follow the flow chart and contact the Area Schools Officer immediately about any suspected cases of coronavirus, even if they are unsure, and discusses if any further action needs to be taken; there is also the option to call the Department of Education Schools helpline.	School testing kits have been delivered to the school for those parents who cannot easily travel to a test centre. (see guidance)	
		The parents will be aware of the process to call for PCR testing and the school will await a result before taking any other action and only respond to symptomatic pupils and adults in the usual way. 		If the test is positive, the action will be discussed with the LAEO.	LFTs for families of primary aged children.	
		Close contacts of a confirmed positive case that are under 18 years or have been fully vaccinated do not need to self-isolate, they will be advised to take a PCR test as soon as possible and can remain in school awaiting the result. This means siblings can remain in school as long as they have a negative PCT test.
