Ladybird Class Weekly Update

We have had another great week, the children all seem settled.

We will be continuing with our set 2 sounds. We will be looking at ar (start the car), or (shut the door) and air (that's not fair). A video will be sent out next week for each sound.

The children are becoming familiar with the RED words and they now know the phrase "you can't FRED a red". We will keep on with the words: your, are, be, of, no.

In Literacy, we will look at Antarctica and Antarctic animals. We will look at the penguin. We will be using the words "Penguins have..." to write simple sentences. As always we will be adding adjectives to improve our writing.

In Numeracy, we will be looking at weight. We will be using the language light, heavy, lighter than and heavier than to compare different objects.

Things to remember: Please remember water bottles. It is getting colder and we provide all round outside learning, please ensure your child has a coat, gloves and a hat – they do get cold! Forest school will remain on a Thursday and PE on a Friday.

Next week:

We have had a very busy but lovely week!

Next week.....

In English we will be writing instructions for the human form art sculptures that we made in our art lesson this week. The children will focus on how to lay out numbered instructions, use imperative verbs and add detail to the instructions so that another child could make one! In guided reading, the children have enjoyed sharing the text 'Rainbow Bear' by Michael Morpurgo and so we will be writing a diary entry based on the journey and perspective of Rainbow Bear!

In Maths we will be moving onto multiplication. We will begin by learning to recognise equal groups, make equal groups and then add equal groups. Some children will apply their understanding in problem solving activities.

In Science we will be looking at how ocean animals are suited to their habitat.

In Geography we will be exploring the climate in the Arctic and answering the question "does the Arctic have seasons?"

In RE we will be writing our own Psalms and prayers, including words which demonstrate worship.

In Art we will be making sculptures out of clay and looking at the work of Henry Moore.

In whole class guided reading we will be exploring the poem 'Arctic Adventures'.
