Dragonfly Class Weekly Update

We have had a lovely first week back!

Next week in English, we will be writing an alternative version of the story of 'A Chair for my Mother' by Vera B. Williams. We have read the story as part of whole class guided reading this week so your child will be familiar with it.

In Maths, we will be learning about fractions. We will be investigating finding a half, quarter and third of an amount and some children will be investigating two quarters and two thirds of an amount. The children will also be taking part in problem solving activities related to fractions.

In Science we will be starting our 'Habitats' topic and identifying things that are living, dead and have never been alive. We will be doing this practically through a sorting activity.

In History we will be sequencing the events of the Great Fire of London using pictures and captions.

In RE we will be starting our 'Parables' unit, specifically looking at 'The Sower and the Seeds'.

Whole Class Guided Reading

Our text is going to be 'The Boy Who Loved Everyone.' We will be exploring diversity, compassion and feelings through this beautiful text.
