### Butterfly Class Weekly Update

We will be continuing next week with our focus on writing sentences, thinking about full stops, capital letters and finger spaces.

In Maths we will be revisiting number bonds and subtraction and addition.

We will be thinking about the different seasons and exploring how the different seasons affect people and the way they live.

In History we will be learning about how people lived in medieval castles.

Our Art project will continue with a focus on print!

### Dragonfly Class Weekly Update

In Maths this week, we will be adding across 10, subtracting across 10 and subtracting a one-digit number from a two-digit number. We will also be solving problems involving these areas.

In English: we will be writing some very special poems next week. They are top secret!

In Science: we will be exploring seaside habitats.

In Topic: we will be learning about people who lived in medieval castles.

Whole class guided reading book will be 'The Journey Home' by Michael Morpurgo.

In Art this week, the children will move on to learning about 'mono printing'. This will be with both pencil and wax crayons. Children will observe an item of their choice and create a sketch of this on carbon copy paper with white paper underneath so a print appears on the paper.
