The nursery rhyme coming home this week is '5 Little Ducks.'

In maths we will be looking at sorting objects and we will be looking at different quantities. We will be using the language "more than", "less than".

Please do have the reading books and yellow reading records in school, daily. We will be changing 1 of the 2 books on a Wednesday.

Please remember to have a water bottle in school each day and waterproof trousers/ jacket for forest school on a Thursday.

History - Comparing the lives and achievements of Columbus and Armstrong.

RE - What do Christians learn from the stories of Jesus?

Art - Continuing with the spiral exploration by applying drawing skills to making observational drawings of shells.

Guided reading - How to Catch a Star. <u>Please return year 1 library books on Mondays and</u> homework books on Tuesdays.

Dragonfly Class Weekly Update

Next Week:

English we will be writing about the importance of water, thinking about Water Aid. We will also be having a handwriting focus.

Maths, we will be taking part in an end of unit assessment, recapping number bonds to 10 and their associated facts and then looking at number bonds to 20 and their associated facts. Within this, we will be solving problems.

Science, we will be continuing to look at how different materials are recycled and the process they go through.

History, we will be looking at similarities and differences between Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus.

RE, we will be continuing the unit 'What do Christian's say about God' and using the stem sentence I/Christians say God is...... because' and creating a class list.

Art, we will be creating drawings inspired by the sense of touch. With eyes shut tightly and NO peeking, an object will be placed in the children's hands and based upon touch only, they will draw whatever their hands 'see'. Once completed, they will then use their sight to draw the object again and compare the two.

Guided reading we will be analysing the poem *The Water Cycle*. We will also try and learn some of the verses.
